Leonard M. Rieser was passionately committed to the ideas and potential of young people and their efforts to build a more peaceful world.

The Rieser Fellowships support undergraduate students who want to pursue projects that explore issues at the intersection of science, global security, and public policy. Any undergraduate student studying at a U.S. college or university is eligible to apply for the Fellowships.

The annual deadline is December 7.

The Rieser Fellowships provide a one-time award of \$2,500–\$5,000 to three to five undergraduate students each year. Since the Fellowship's inception in 1999, the Bulletin has awarded more than \$75,000 to 21 ambitious undergraduates from outstanding schools including Stanford, Duke, Princeton, Michigan State, Wisconsin and Dartmouth.

Leonard M. Rieser (1922–1998) was a physicist, professor, mentor, and vocal advocate for the peaceful resolution of conflict. Through the Leonard M. Rieser Fellowship in Science, Technology, and Global Security, we honor his belief in the ability of the next generation to play a critical role in finding solutions to persistent global problems.
