For our annual gathering, Conversations Before Midnight (CBM) 2023, we will remain virtual, acknowledging that our audience is spread throughout the United States and around the world. This year, we are thrilled to feature Christopher Nolan, an award-winning and Academy Award-nominated director, as our keynote speaker.
